

POTOMAC VALLEY GOLDEN RETRIEVER CLUB Guidelines and Requirements for Annual Awards

I. TROPHY GUIDELINES

A. TROPHY DEFINITIONS

1. The term **Challenge Trophy** shall mean any trophy which may be awarded for permanent possession after winning the trophy three times, provided the trophy is replaced as detailed in these regulations. Individual trophy requirements will specify if the three wins must be with the same dog. The trophy is the property of the PVGRC until retired.
2. The term **Perpetual Trophy** shall mean any trophy which has been offered for continuous competition regardless of the number of times it has been awarded. The trophy is the property of the PVGRC.
3. The term **Annual Trophy** shall mean any trophy which is awarded for a 12-month competition period. These trophies become the property of the trophy recipient.
4. The term **Competition Year** shall mean that calendar year beginning January 1 and ending December 31, except where otherwise noted.

B. RECIPIENT ELIGIBILITY

1. The recipient must be a member in good standing with the PVGRC, The American Kennel Club, and in the case of Juniors, sons or daughters of members in good standing will be allowed.
2. To be eligible to receive a PVGRC Challenge, Perpetual or Annual trophy, PVGRC members must be "active" for the year in which they apply for the trophy. To fulfill the requirements for "active membership" members must acquire five (5) points per year. Points may be obtained in any of the following ways:

C. CO-OWNED DOGS

In the case of co-owned dogs, unless otherwise specified in the individual trophy description, only one co-owner need be a PVGRC and AKC member in good standing to be eligible for PVGRC trophies, and the dog's primary residence must be with the PVGRC member. Primary residence means 8 months of the competition year.

D. OBEDIENCE AND RALLY TROPHIES, GENERAL INFORMATION

Only those scores obtained while the owner of the dog is a PVGRC and AKC member in good standing are applicable. The dog must be owned or co-owned by the member applying for the award and its primary residence must be with that member.

Members can apply for more than one obedience or rally trophy, but if a dog has the highest average score in more than one **Annual** Obedience Trophy category, the award shall be for the more advanced Annual Obedience Trophy. Obedience trophy categories will be in the following descending order of advancement: Utility B, Utility A, Open B, Open A, Novice B, Novice A. Rally trophy categories will be in the following descending order of advancement: Excellent B, Excellent A, Advanced B, Advanced A, Novice B and Novice A. When the winner of one of the Obedience Trophies (based on average of scores which qualified the dog for the title) is also the winner of the comparable level **Annual** Obedience Trophy (based on the dog's 3 highest scores earned during the competition year, whether or not those scores qualified the dog for the title), both awards will be engraved on the same plaque. For this purpose: The Novice A Trophy and/or Novice B Trophy is comparable level to the Annual Novice Obedience Trophy. The Open A Trophy and/or Open B Trophy is comparable level to the Annual Open Obedience Trophy. The Utility A Trophy, Utility B Trophy and/or Utility Dog Excellent Trophy is comparable level to the Annual Utility Obedience Trophy.

E. AGILITY TROPHIES, GENERAL INFORMATION

Only those scores obtained while the owner of the dog is a PVGRC and AKC member in good standing are applicable. The dog must be owned or co-owned by the member applying for the award and its primary residence must be with that member. Members can apply for more than one agility trophy, but if a dog has the highest average score in more than one **Annual** Agility Trophy category, the award shall be for the more advanced Annual Agility Trophy. Trophy categories will be in the following descending order of advancement: Master Agility Excellent, Agility Excellent, Open, Novice B, Novice A. When the winner of one of the Annual Agility Trophies is also the winner of one or more other **Annual** Agility Trophies, all awards will be engraved on the same plaque.

F. APPLYING FOR A TROPHY

To be considered for a Challenge, Perpetual or Annual trophy, members must apply in writing to the Trophy Chairman. For convenience, application forms are printed in the PVGRC newsletter, and can also be downloaded from the PVGRC web site at <http://www.pvgrc.org>. It is required that members applying for trophies report wins, placements and/or scores along with the name of the dog, name, date and location of the show and the name of the judge. When applying for a trophy, the individual member must also report activity points earned during the year. Deadline for submitting applications for trophies will be determined by the Trophy Chairman, and will be published in the PVGRC newsletter.

G. CHALLENGE TROPHY RETIREMENT

When a trophy recipient becomes eligible to retire a challenge trophy, that recipient may a) choose to take permanent possession of the trophy provided he/she replaces the trophy with one of similar type and value and which does not change the intent of the original trophy; or b) choose not to retire the trophy and return it to competition. If the eligible recipient chooses not to retire a trophy, he/she will not be entitled to that option again unless he/she wins the trophy again. The eligible recipient must notify the Trophy Chairman in writing of his/her intent to retire a Challenge Trophy within 3 months of winning it. The recipient must also include a trophy replacement proposal. All replacement trophies must maintain the intent of the original trophy and must be approved by the Board of Directors. Once approved by the Board, the replacement must be properly prepared before the next annual PVGRC banquet. The eligible recipient may name a replacement trophy in honor of the dog that retired it. The replacement trophy nameplate shall carry only the name of the dog that retired the previous trophy without the need for additional nameplates attached setting forth the previous trophy name and winners.

H. TROPHY RECIPIENT AGREEMENT

Due to the fact that PVGRC's Challenge and Perpetual trophies have significant and historical value which cannot be replaced, each member awarded a Challenge or Perpetual trophy is required to sign a Trophy Recipient Agreement before being allowed to take possession of the trophy. (See below.)

I. TROPHY ENGRAVING

All PVGRC Challenge, Perpetual and Annual trophies shall be engraved at the expense of PVGRC. The trophies shall be engraved with the winning dog's name following the layout, type size and typeface used by previous winners so as to maintain a consistency in the way the names are displayed on the trophy. Titles to be engraved shall be limited to American Kennel Club and/or GRCA titles. No additional information or wording shall be added to the Trophy without specific approval of the PVGRC Board of Directors. Trophies shall be engraved prior to the Annual Awards Banquet. The Trophy Chairman, or an individual appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be responsible for the engraving.

J. TROPHY DAMAGE

Once awarded, recipients are responsible for any damage to a trophy including total replacement if the trophy is destroyed. Any recipient returning a trophy in damaged condition will continue to be eligible to win future challenge or perpetual trophies, but might not be permitted to take possession of the trophy. This will be decided by the Board of Directors.

K. TROPHY CHAIRMAN

The Trophy Chairman shall receive all applications for PVGRC's Challenge, Perpetual and Annual trophies, and shall, based on applications received and verification of eligibility requirements, recommend to the Board of Directors at their annual January meeting, those applicants entitled to receive trophies. In addition, the Trophy Chairman shall:

1. Contact all current year's recipients with instructions to ensure delivery of all trophies prior to PVGRC's annual awards banquet.
2. Attend PVGRC annual awards banquet, unpack, inspect and display the trophies.
3. Coordinate the signing of Trophy Recipient Agreements at the conclusion of the Annual Awards Banquet.
4. Ensure that new recipients receive instructions on trophy care.
5. Store and/or engrave any un-awarded trophies or unclaimed trophies and store any trophy plaques from retired or replaced trophies
6. Keep up-to-date records of all PVGRC trophies and provide inquirers with trophy guidelines and related information.

L. NEW TROPHIES

New trophies may be recommended to the Board of Directors at any time provided they are not duplications of an existing award. Only trophies offered for significant accomplishments should be submitted.

M. DONOR ELIGIBILITY

No person may be a donor of more than one trophy at any given time. No other trophy may be offered by that person or by his or her immediate family until the previously offered trophy shall have been retired or withdrawn.

N. TROPHY OWNERSHIP

Any trophy donated shall become the property of PVGRC until permanently retired, if so stipulated. If any trophy has not been challenged for five years in succession, the Board of Directors may where possible, with the consent of the donor, change the original stipulations.

**O. TROPHY RECIPIENTS AGREEMENT
FOR CHALLENGE OR PERPETUAL TROPHIES**

1. The recipient attests that he/she is a member in good standing of the Potomac Valley Golden Retriever Club and the American Kennel Club and meets the eligibility requirements for the awarding of this trophy.
2. The recipient is expected to maintain the trophy in its original condition as received, keeping in mind its unique value.
3. Should the trophy become damaged while in the custody of the recipient, the recipient shall be responsible for notifying the PVGRC Trophy Chairman who will guide the recipient in the restoration of the trophy to its original condition at the recipient's expense. Should the trophy be lost or destroyed while in the custody of the recipient, the recipient will be held responsible for obtaining an exact reproduction of the original or if this is not possible, one of equal value as approved by the PVGRC Board of Directors.
4. The recipient shall return the trophy clean and undamaged in its wrappings or case (if one was provided) as directed by the Trophy Chairman at the annual PVGRC banquet. While every effort will be made to remind the recipient of the trophy's return, it is the sole responsibility of the recipient to see that the trophy is returned on time.
5. Should the recipient move or relocate from the area while in the possession of the trophy, the recipient shall immediately advise the Trophy Chairman of the recipient's new address and phone number and shall be guided by the Trophy Chairman in the various means of returning the trophy to the Trophy Chairman in time for the PVGRC annual banquet, if the recipient cannot otherwise personally return said trophy. P. CHALLENGE TROPHIES, DESCRIPTION AND CRITERIA FOR AWARD

1. GLORY J'S MEMORIAL OBEDIENCE TROPHY

Donated by: Mr. and Mrs. Minor S. Jameson, Jr.

This trophy is offered to members of the PVGRC to the Golden Retriever dog or bitch, owner-handled, making the highest average score in attaining a Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, or Utility Dog title during the calendar year; the average score to be based on the first three (3) qualifying scores. The date of the third qualifying score will determine the year in which the title is obtained. In the event of a tie, the trophy will be awarded to the dog earning the higher title. To retire the trophy, it must be won three (3) times by the same owner/handler, not necessarily with the same dog.

2. CH GLORY J'S TORCH OF SUN DANCE UDT, TROPHY

Donated by: Susan S. Slade and Warren J. Cox

This trophy will be awarded annually to the Golden Retriever, owned by a member of the PVGRC who is an amateur as defined, and is amateur-handled, whose combined performance in dog shows and obedience trials is most outstanding. For this trophy, the following person shall be deemed to be professional and not eligible: Any person who has ever held a license as either a professional handler or judge, or is paid to show dogs. To be eligible a dog must earn points during the year in both shows and obedience trials. The PVGRC Board of Directors shall determine the winner of this trophy from the list of eligible dogs provided by the Trophy Committee. The Trophy Committee will include the Highest Combined Scoring Dog and the names of all other dogs whose point score is within 25% of the Highest Scoring Dog, together with a breakdown of points between show and obedience

for each dog. From the list, the Board shall award the trophy to the dog that, in their opinion, has the most balanced performance. For example:

A dog with 25 points; 10 in breed, and 15 in obedience; is to be placed ahead of a dog with 30 points, with 5 in breed and 25 in obedience.

The Committee is to verify their point count with the owner prior to submission to the Board. To obtain permanent possession of this trophy, it must be won three (3) times by the same owner, not necessarily with the same dog. In the event that an eligible individual should desire to retire this trophy, he shall replace it with a suitable new trophy bearing the same requirements. The point scale is as follows:

Show

Best of Breed - one point more than best of winners (in the event that Best of Breed shall be won by a class dog, to gain the additional point, there must be competition from one or more "specials").

Best of Opposite - one point more than winners of that sex (if won by a class dog, competition for Best of Opposite Sex from a "special" is required for the extra point).

Best of Winners and Winners - actual number of points won

Reserve Winners - one less point than winners, but no less than one point.

Any other ribbon placing in a regular class - one point.

Any Group placing shall gain an additional 10 points beyond those won in breed competition. No more than 5 points may be won at any show in breed competition.

Obedience - Points are to be given for competition in Regular Classes only.

Highest Scoring Dog in Trial - 10 points in addition to those earned in class.

First Place - 5 points
Second Place - 4 points
Third Place - 3 points
Fourth Place - 2 points
Any other qualifying score - 1 point

NOTE: A tie is equivalent to a win

Q. PERPETUAL TROPHIES, DESCRIPTION AND CRITERIA FOR AWARD

1. THE GOLDA POTEKEMEN MEMORIAL NOVICE OBEDIENCE TROPHY

Donated by: Barry, Stacey and Bruce Potemken

This trophy is to be awarded annually by a majority vote of the Board of Directors of the Potomac Valley Golden Retriever Club (PVGRC) to the member whose owner-handled Golden Retriever has the three (3) highest average qualifying scores in either Novice A and/or Novice B which qualified him for the Companion Dog Title, regardless of the length of time taken to accomplish this, and with the third score having been obtained in the year that the trophy is awarded. Only those scores obtained while the applicant is a PVGRC member in good standing are applicable. To qualify for this trophy, the owner must submit the scores in writing, with the name and date of the shows at which the dog qualified.

2. GOLDEN PINE MEMORIAL TROPHY

Donated by: Mrs. Josiah T. Semans

This trophy is to be awarded annually to the owner of the top winning Golden Retriever, of either sex, in member and licensed shows. One point will be given for each dog defeated in competition as reported in the AKC Gazette. Credit is given only for wins of Winners or better which includes select dog and select bitch, except that the Reserve Winners will be credited if it is earned at a show in which the Reserve Winners has earned AKC championship points. Only those points will be counted that are won while the owner of the dog is a member in good standing of the PVGRC. This is to be a perpetual trophy and will be retained by the winner for the year and shall be inscribed with the year that the trophy was won, the name of the dog and the name of the owner (in that order).

3. THE SILK AND THE WIND TROPHY

Donated by: D'Alex Childers and Alahna Goldens

This trophy is presented annually to the Best of Opposite Sex to the winner of the Golden Pines Memorial Trophy. The requirements for winning this trophy shall be identical to the requirements for the Golden Pines Memorial Trophy, specifically: one point will be given for each dog defeated in competition in member and licensed shows as reported in the AKC Gazette. Credit is given only for wins of Winners or better which includes select dog and select bitch, except that the Reserve Winners will be credited if it is earned at a show in which the Reserve Winners has earned AKC championship points. Only those points will be counted that are won while the owner of the dog is a member in good standing with the PVGRC.

4. THE WINTERSET TROPHY

Donated by: Greg Wessel and William Stockberger

This trophy is to be awarded annually to the **owner/handler** of the top winning Golden Retriever, of either sex, in member and licensed shows. Only wins completed by the owner as the handler will be counted. One point will be given for each dog (of either sex) defeated in competition and reported in the AKC Gazette. Credit is given only for wins of Winners or better which includes select dog and select bitch. Only those points will be counted that are won while the owner of the dog is a member in good standing of the PVGRC. This is to be a perpetual trophy and will be retained by the winner for the year and shall be inscribed with the year that the trophy was won, the name of the dog and the name of the owner.

5. THE CAN CH DANNEBROG DISTANCE RUNNER, UD, JH, WCX; CAN UD, WCI TROPHY

Donated by: Dr. M. C. Zink

The primary purpose of this award is to recognize a dog's versatility; a secondary purpose is to give credit for more advanced titles in each area of endeavor. A member may apply for this award for a particular dog as many times as he/she wishes, as long as the dog is alive during the award year. However, a dog may only win this award once. The dog must be owned or co-owned by the member who is applying for the award and its primary residence must be with that member. Points are awarded for AKC or GRCA titles only. The point system for each of the five fields of endeavor is as follows:

Points are awarded for only one title from each area of endeavor. To qualify for the award, a dog must have titles in at least two areas of endeavor. If a dog has titles in two different areas of endeavor, the total number of points is doubled; in three areas of endeavor, the number of points is tripled; in four areas, quadrupled, five areas quintupled. Ties will be broken as follows:

1. The award will go to the dog with titles in the most different areas.
2. If still tied, the award will go to the dog with the highest field title. Field titles will be considered to be in the following descending order of difficulty: FCH/AFC, FCH or AFCH, ***, MH, SH, **, WCX, JH, WC.
3. If still tied, the award will go to the dog with the highest average score obtaining the three legs of its highest obedience title.

6. GOLLY G's GOLDEN FUTURES TROPHY in honor of CH BARGELLOS GOLLY G's LOUISE CD, SH, WC

Donated by: Teri Poetker

The purpose of this trophy is to recognize the top junior dog or bitch for outstanding achievements in at least two areas of endeavor and to encourage well-rounded participation in multiple areas of activity. This award is designed to recognize young, talented, multipurpose dogs, but not to push them beyond their growth and physical development. It is for this reason that the more physically advanced obedience, field, and agility titles have been omitted from the list of achievements qualifying a dog for points toward this trophy. The annual period for this trophy is January 1 to December 31. The junior dog/bitch must be between the age of three and eighteen months during the award year. If the dog surpasses the age of 18 months during the year but was 18 months or less on January 1, he may apply for the trophy but only those points obtained between the age of 3 and 18 months will be considered. An individual dog or bitch may win this award only once. Points are awarded for AKC or GRCA titles, qualifying legs, and achievements at matches.

The point system for each of the four fields of endeavor is as follows:

1. Obedience
 - Sanctioned match
 - Placement in a regular class with competition* - 0.5 point
 - Licensed Show
 - 1 CD qualifying leg - 0.5 point
 - 2 CD qualifying legs - 1.0 points
 - CD title - 1.5 points
 - 1 CDX qualifying leg - 2.0 points
 - 2 CDX qualifying legs - 2.5 points
 - CDX title - 3.0 points
2. Conformation
 - Sanctioned match
 - Placement with competition* - 0.5 point
 - Best Puppy/Adult with competition* - 1.0 point
 - Specialty Sweepstakes
 - Best in Sweepstakes/BOSS 2.0 points
 - Licensed Shows
 - 1st place in class with competition* 0.5 point
 - Reserve Winners Dog/Bitch (competition) 1.0 point
 - Winners Dog/Bitch with competition* 1.5 points
 - Major Reserve Winners Dog/Bitch 2.0 points
 - Major Winners Dog/Bitch 2.5 points
 - Championship 3.0 points
3. Field
 - Puppy Stakes (In conjunction with WC/WCX or Hunting Test)
 - Placement with competition* - 0.5 points
 - GRCA Working Certificate and Working Certificate Excellent

WC - 1.0 point
WCX - 2.5 points

Junior Hunter Title - 2.0 points

5. Rally

RN title - 0.5 point
RA title - 1.0 points

*With competition is defined as competing with and defeating at least one other dog/bitch.
Points are awarded for only the highest title/achievement from each of the 4 areas of endeavor. For Example:

1. A dog receiving two legs toward the CDX title will receive 2.5 points. A dog earning the CDX title will receive 3 points.
2. A dog receiving the WCX title and a Derby JAM will receive 2.5 points only, since both achievements are in the filed category.

If a dog has titles/achievements in two different areas of endeavor, the total number of points is doubled; in three areas of endeavor, the number of points is tripled; in four areas, quadrupled.

Ties will be broken as follows:

1. The award will go to the dog/bitch with titles/achievements in the most different areas.
 2. If still tied, the award will go to the dog with the highest title or achievement (i.e. CH, TDX, CDX, Derby Placement).
 3. If still tied, the award will go to the dog with the highest score obtained for any leg received at a Licensed Obedience Trial.
- When additional AKC or GRCA titles are introduced or revised, the areas of endeavor listed above may be updated.
 - For match/stake win verification, a photocopy of award ribbon and written verification signed by judge is required. Written verification should indicate date, location, event, placement, total entry of class and judge's signature.

**7. CH WATERFORD TRI-J RORY O'RYE, UD, JH, WCX, VCX VETERAN TROPHY
Veteran Breed Obedience Rally Trophy**

Donated by: Jody and John Culver

This perpetual trophy is to be awarded annually to the Veteran Golden Retriever dog or bitch, 8 years of age or older, owned by a member in good standing of the Potomac Valley Golden Retriever Club. If the dog is co-owned, it must live with the member applying for the trophy. The purpose of this trophy is to recognize those veteran Golden Retrievers still participating in Breed and Obedience or Breed and Rally and their owners for enjoying their Veterans to the utmost. The Board of Directors of PVGRC shall determine the winner of this trophy based on total points earned during the competition year.

This trophy may be won by the same dog only once.

The order of precedence for preference given to the dog or bitch with points in the following areas of endeavor shall be: Breed, Obedience and Rally; Breed and Obedience; Breed and Rally.

Accomplishments in Breed only, Obedience only or Rally only will not count.

When applying for this trophy, applicants must include the dog's date of birth.

The Point System is as follows:

Breed (Regular or Veteran classes)

Best of Breed: 25 points
Best of Opposite to Best of Breed: 20 points
Best of Winners or Winners: 10 points
Reserve Winners: 5 points
Best Veteran in Specialty Show: 15 points (with or without competition)
Best of Opposite to Best Veteran in Specialty Show: 10 points
Best Veteran in Sweeps: 10 points (with or without competition)
Best of Opposite to Best Veteran In Sweeps: 5 points
Any Group Placements: 25 points

Class Placements:

1st place 4 points
2nd place 3 points
3rd place 2 points
4th place 1 point

Obedience (Regular or Veteran Classes)

Class placements:

1st place 15 points
2nd place 10 points
3rd place 5 points
4th place 3 points
Qualifying score: 1 point

In addition to Class placement points add:

High In Trial 25 points
High Combined 20 points

Rally

1st place 15 points
2nd place 10 points
3rd place 5 points
4th place 3 points
Qualifying score: 1 point

Bonus Points

In addition to the point scale above, bonus points will be given as follows:

- 20 bonus points for the Veteran dog or bitch who earns points in both Breed and Obedience on the same day.
- 10 bonus points for the dog or bitch 10 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER earning points in breed OR obedience OR rally (one win only).

In the case of a tie, the trophy will be awarded to the oldest Veteran dog or bitch.

8. MEADOWPOND CLAIM TO FAME, UDTX, JH, WCX MEMORIAL TROPHY

Donated by: Dr. Clayton Kilrain and Sharon Kilrain

This trophy is to be awarded to the oldest dog earning either an AKC or GRCA performance title in the preceding year. This will include any AKC title in the area of Obedience, Tracking, Agility, Hunt Tests or Field Trials, as well as the GRCA Working Certificate (WC) and Working Certificate Excellent (WCX). It must be the first time the dog has earned the title. The dog must be at least eight (8) years of age at the time the title was completed/earned. The trophy may be won by the same dog only once.

9. CH BETABERK'S ROCKCREST APACHE* TROPHY**

Donated by: Mr. and Mrs. John I. Kelly

This trophy is to be awarded by a majority vote of the Board of Directors of the PVGRC to the active, participating member whose amateur-handled Golden Retriever wins the highest number of points in field trials during the preceding calendar year. Only those points will be counted that are won while the owner is a member in good standing of the Club. The following point system will be used:

This is to be a perpetual trophy and will be retained by the winner for the year and shall be inscribed with the year that the trophy was won, the name of the dog, and the name of the owner. Any changes in the requirements for the awarding of the trophy shall be approved by the donors.

10. THE GOLDSEEKER AGILITY TROPHY

Donated by Bets Keen and Gary Arbegast

This trophy is to be awarded annually to the Golden Retriever who earns the highest number of MACH points during the competition year. Only those MACH points earned while the applicant is a PVGRC member in good standing are applicable. The dog must be owned or co-owned by the member applying for the trophy and its primary residence must be with that member. This is to be a perpetual trophy and will be retained by the winner for the year. It shall be inscribed with the year that the trophy was won, the name of the dog and the name of the owner.

MACH points are those earned in Excellent B AND Excellent B Jumpers during the competition year. To qualify for this trophy, the owner must submit the points in writing with the names and dates of the trials at which the dog earned the MACH points. (preferably the printout provided by AKC).

This trophy may be won only once by the same dog.

Ties shall be broken as follows: The award will go to the Golden Retriever earning the most Double Q's during the competition year. If still tied, the award shall go to the Golden Retriever earning the highest placements in either Excellent B or Excellent B Jumpers.

11. HENRY E. "ED" MAGNUSON, JR. MEMORIAL TROPHY

Donated by friends of Henry E. "Ed" Magnuson, Jr.

This trophy is to be offered annually to honor Ed and his dog "Brooke, Sunfire's Free Spirit CD MH WCX, and will be awarded to the oldest combined ages of a PVGRC member in good standing and his or her dog who earns an AKC Hunt Test Title or a GRCA WC or WCX title during the competition year. The dog must be owned or co-owned by the

member applying for the trophy and must have lived with the trophy applicant for at least 8 months of the competition year. This is to be a perpetual trophy and will be retained by the winner for one year. This trophy can be won only once by the same member and dog; however, it can be won more than once by the same member with a different dog. The GRCA rules allow a titled WC or WCX dog to continue to enter the WC or WCX test, however to be eligible for this award only the first title will count. The minimum age of the member shall be 55 years old. There shall be no minimum age of the dog. The dog must be solely trained and handled to the AKC Hunt Test or GRCA WC or WCX titles by the member applying for the trophy. If a tie should occur, the trophy shall be awarded to the oldest member.

12. The Mark Maisel Trophy

The purpose of this trophy is to recognize the top junior dog or bitch for outstanding achievements in field areas of endeavor.

The annual period for this trophy is January 1 to December 31. The junior dog/bitch must be between the age of three and twenty-four (3 – 24) months during the award year. If the dog surpasses the age of 24 months during the year but was 24 months or less on January 1, he/she may apply for the trophy but only the points obtained between the age of 3 and 24 months will be considered.

An individual dog or bitch may win this award only once.

There are three areas: puppy stakes/WC/WCX; hunt tests; and field trials. Points within a category are not cumulative – only the highest point title is recognized.

Points are awarded for only the highest title/achievement from each of the areas of endeavor. For example, a dog receiving two legs toward the JH title will receive 2 points; a dog earning the JH title will receive 4 points.

In the case of a tie, the trophy be given to first, the dog with achievements in the greater number of areas, and then secondly, the dog with the most advanced title in any category. If the tie cannot be broken by these two criteria, all dogs involved in the tie be rewarded.

For match/stake win verification, a photocopy of award ribbon and written verification signed by judge is required. Written verification should indicate date, location, event, placement, total entry of class and judge's signature.

In case of a tie, the dog with the highest number of points for placements shall be awarded the trophy. The points shall be as follows:

First place 4 points	Third place 2 points
Second place 3 points	Fourth place 1 point

8. JUNIOR RALLY TROPHY

The PVGRC will award a trophy each year at the Annual Awards Banquet to the Junior member or child of an adult member who acquired the most points in Rally classes in licensed shows during the year. The point scale will be as follows:

First place 4 points	Third place 2 points
Second place 3 points	Fourth place 1 point

In addition, one-half of a point will be given for each qualifying score received during the year. Only scores obtained before the Junior's eighteenth birthday may be counted toward the winning of this trophy.

V. ANNUAL TROPHIES - CRITERIA FOR AWARD - FIELD TROPHIES

The PVGRC offers trophies each year for:

1. The Top Winning Open Field Trial Golden Retriever
2. The Top Winning Qualifying Field Trial Golden Retriever, and
3. The Top Winning Derby Field Trial Golden Retriever

that are amateur-handled on the basis of a point system used for Licensed Trials and Sanctioned Field Trials. Points for all trophies will be awarded to the dogs only during the time that the owner is a member in good standing of the PVGRC.

For Sanctioned Field Trial placements or JAM verification, a photocopy of the award ribbon and written verification signed by judge is required. Information should include date, location, event, placement and judge's signature.

A dog that receives two first places in the qualifying stakes at licensed field trails will receive 25 bonus points.

II. ROSETTE GUIDELINES

All Golden Retrievers, other retrieving breeds, poodles and Irish water spaniels receiving American Kennel Club (AKC) or Golden Retriever Club of America (GRCA) titles during the calendar year will receive a rosette presented at the Awards Banquet. To be eligible for a rosette, the owner of the dog must have been a member of PVGRC on the date the dog earned its title. "Active membership" as described earlier under the section on guidelines, is NOT a requirement for a rosette. In the case of co-owned dogs, only one co-owner need be a PVGRC and AKC member in good standing to be eligible for a rosette, and the dog's primary residence must be with the PVGRC member. Primary residence means 8 months of the competition year. When applying for rosettes, all official AKC titles and GRCA titles (Working Certificate and Working Certificate Excellent, Two and Three Star Goldens, Show Dog Hall of Fame, Obedience Dog Hall of Fame, Agility Dog Hall of Fame, Dual Dog Hall of Fame, CCA, VC, VCX) must be reported to the appropriate person by January 15th of the year following the award year. For convenience, application forms are printed in the PVGRC newsletter, and can also be downloaded from the PVGRC web site at <http://www.pvgrc.org>.

III. VETERAN ACHIEVEMENT AWARD GUIDELINES

Veterans (age 8 or over) who earn one or more AKC or GRCA performance titles in the award year in Obedience, Rally, Tracking, Agility, Hunt Test, Field Trial, WC (first award) or WCX (first award), and, who do not win the Jason Trophy, will be honored with an appropriate award at the Annual Awards Banquet. Five activity points are required. Be sure to apply for the MEADOWPOND CLAIM TO FAME, UDTX, JH, WCX MEMORIAL TROPHY if you are eligible for this award.
